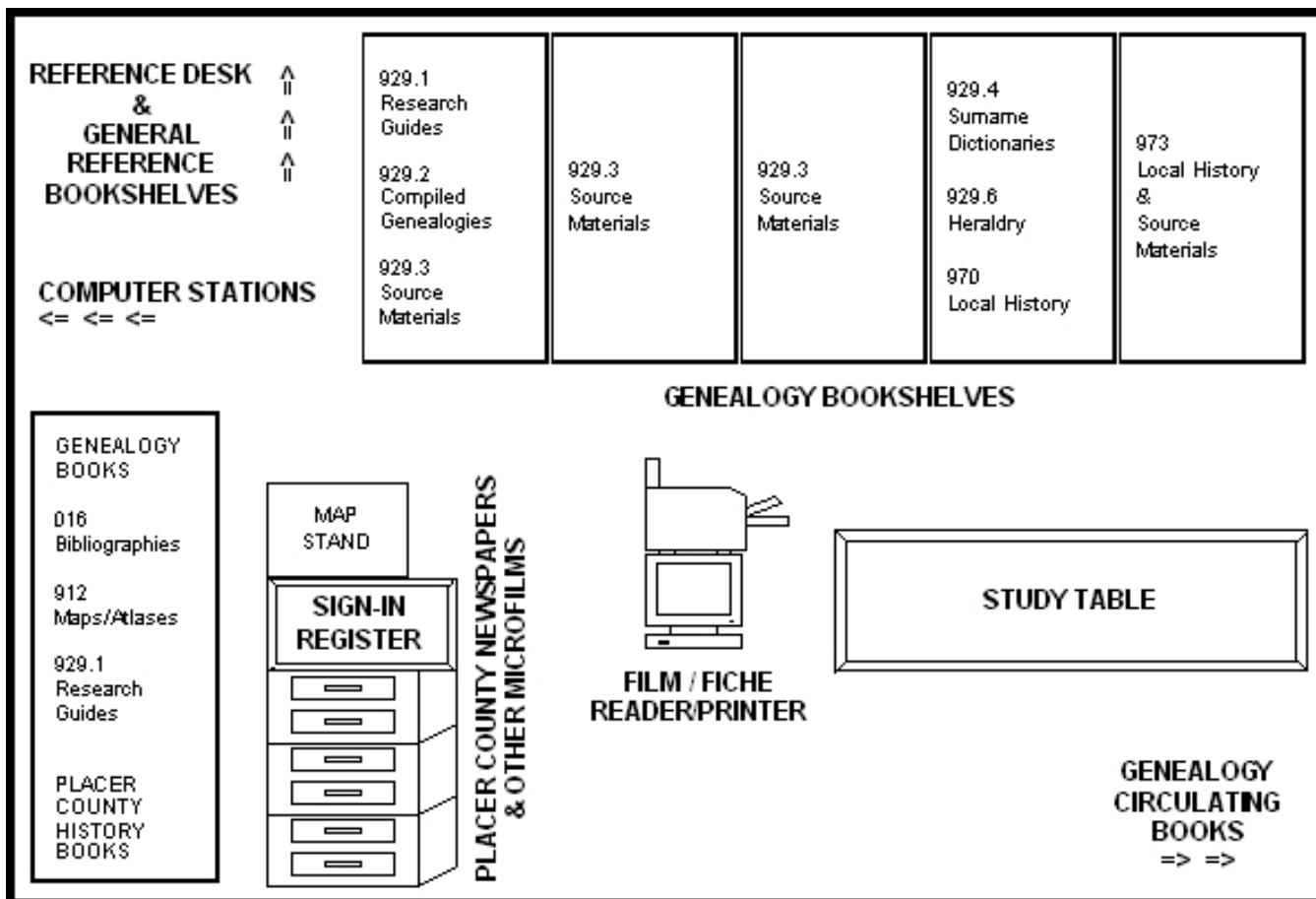

### Genealogy Sign-In Register

### Shelf List

A quick-reference listing of the library's genealogy holdings. Located in the red binder on top of the microfilm cabinets.

### Genealogy Bookshelves

The book collection includes bibliographies, special atlases, research guides, compiled genealogies, source materials, surname dictionaries, heraldry, and local histories.

### Placer County Local History Bookshelves

The local history collection includes books on Placer County communities and people. Some include biographical sketches on local citizens of the past.

### Newspaper Microfilm Cabinet

On microfilm are Placer County newspapers dating from 1852 to the present. Titles include the *Auburn Journal*, *Colfax Record*, *Dutch Flat Forum*, *Newcastle News*, *Placer Argus*, *Placer County Leader*, *Placer County Republican*, *Placer Herald*, *Placer Times*, *Stars & Stripes*, and *Union Advocate*.

### Census & Other Microfilm Cabinet

On microfilm are Placer County cemetery records, the 1852 California state census, and the U.S. census for Placer and other California counties for the years 1850, 1860, 1870, 1880, 1900, 1910 and 1920.

### Microfilm/Microfiche Reader/Printer

Paper copies from microfilm or microfiche cost 25¢ per page. Pay at the Service & Information Desk.

### Computer Stations

Worldwide holdings include reference books, atlases & gazetteers, Bible records, biographical indexes, cemetery records, census indexes, city directories, histories, compiled genealogies, manuscript collections, military & pension lists, probate/will indexes & abstracts, vital record indexes, and more. Use the card catalog to access these materials.

## MICROFILM

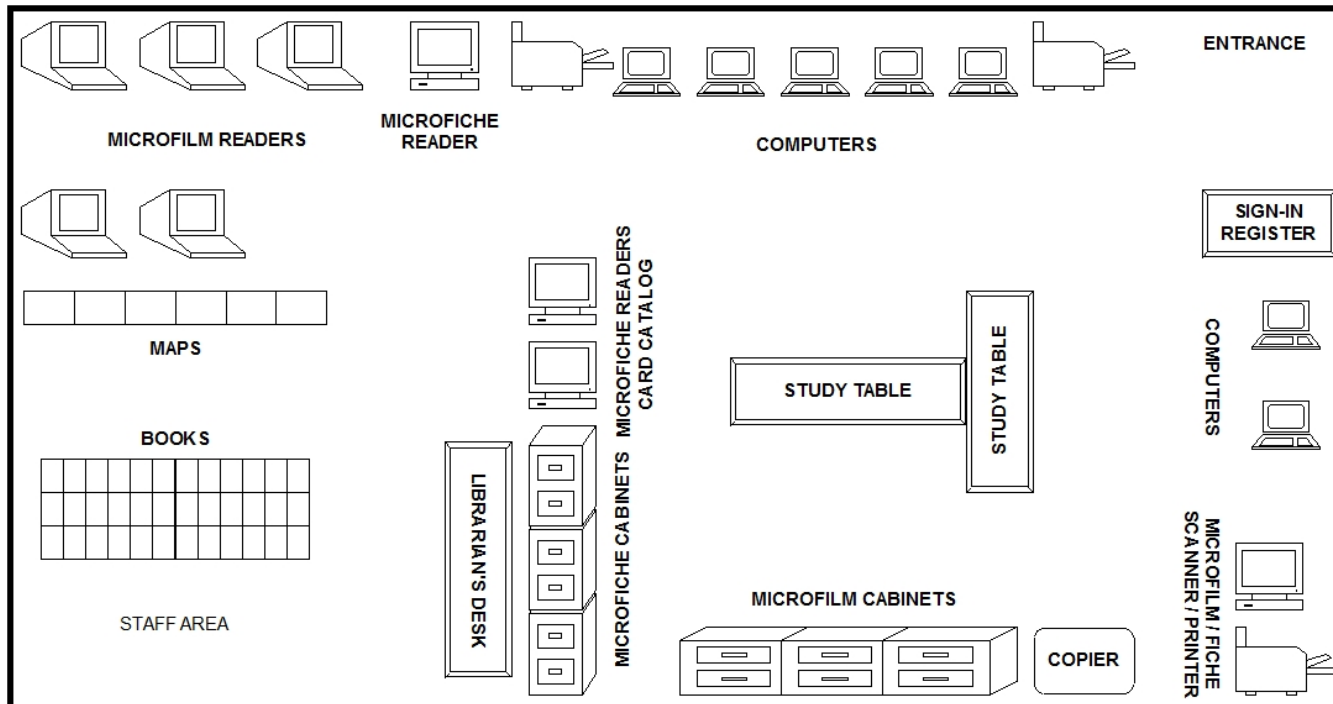
Various published and manuscript research records. Use card catalog to access materials held in-house. Additional microfilms may be ordered on loan from the Family History Library via the online FamilySearch Catalog.

## BOOKS

## FAMILYSEARCH COMPUTERS

Free access to the Internet and FamilySearch web site, plus fourteen premium websites: 19th Century British Newspapers, Alexander Street Press: American Civil War Collection, Ancestry.com, ArkivDigital Online, FindMyPast, Fold3, The Genealogist, Godfrey Memorial Library, HeritageQuest Online, Historic Map Works, NewspaperARCHIVES, Origins.net, Paper Trail, and World Vital Records. The online collections are worldwide and include census records, Social Security Death Index, cemetery recordings, vital records, immigration, land and military records, digitized books, newspapers, maps, and more.
