Amy is a nationally recognized genealogist and presenter. Whether it's through her Generations Café podcast, free Facebook group, or the Generation Connection membership, she is dedicated to helping people discover their own family history and make those connections for themselves.

Amy holds a Masters Degree in Library and Information Science from Kent State University. She has held a Certified Genealogist® credential since 1995. Amy has worked at Ancestry.com, served as the series editor for the National Genealogical Society Guides, published by Rutledge Hill Press, and was the co-author of Online Roots in that series.

Looking at my calendar, I realized that May is National Military Appreciation Month. While we should always appreciate our military personnel, I am glad that we have set aside a month to honor them. In my life, I have known four generations who participated in military service. Both of my grandfathers participated in World War I; my father and his three brothers, as well as my mom's brother, all took part in World War II; my brother served in the Air Force between Vietnam and Iraq; and my grandson is currently serving in the Navy.

These are just the men that I knew (and still know) personally. Many more of my ancestors served in our country's service over the course of the past 250 years, and I know that most of you have similar stories.

Why not spend a little time researching their units and their experiences? Where did they serve, what ship or regiment were they in, how long was their

service, and, sadly, were they injured, imprisoned or killed? It's important to tell those stories, as well as the stories of those who remained at home. How were their lives altered? The impact of a family member's military service effects the lives of the whole family.

Records are available in many places:
FamilySearch, Ancestry, MyHeritage and Fold3 are all important repositories. But also check state archives, NARA, and local repositories, such as county libraries and societies. You may find applications in lineage societies which provide clues to original records. And don't forget that, in some years, the Federal Census asked questions about military service, which may provide clues for you. Have some fun searching out these veterans, and sharing their photos and stories with your friends and family. Let's help keep these memories alive. And let those who are currently serving know how much they are appreciated.

2022 Placer County Genealogical Society General Meeting Minutes April 25, 2022 - 7:00 p.m. Beecher Room, Auburn - Placer County Library and via ZOOM

Call to Order - President Cyndi Davis called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. Members were present in the room and by Zoom.

Welcome - Cyndi welcomed the members and the speaker Stephanie K. West who joined the meeting by Zoom. She noted that there were more members attending in person than by Zoom.

The Treasurer's Report (Mar. 2022) and the Minutes from Previous Meeting (Mar. 28, 2022) were in the April newsletter. There were no questions or comments.

Bill Heisch, Registrar, was not present so Cyndi reported that the current membership is 82 paid plus 25 family members for a total of 107 members. She noted a slight decline in membership from last year.

Old Business -

Date: 15 April 2022

In November 2021, the Board of Directors were advised that the Beecher Room at the Auburn Placer County Library would not be available for our 7:00 P.M. on a day and time as determined by the regular monthly General Meetings on the fourth Thursday of the month beginning in 2022. The Board then researched and considered several options, including meeting on the regular fourth Thursday of the month at a variety of different locations, or changing our meeting date and continuing to meet at the Beecher Room on a different night. After reviewing the options, it was decided to continue meeting at the Beecher Room on the fourth Monday of the month for 2022.

The PCGS By-Laws, Article 4, Section 2, paragraph 2 (below) specifies that our regular meetings are to be held on the fourth Thursday of the month. Therefore, a change in the by-law is necessary. After discussion, the Board decided to allow for some flexibility in the wording, should it be necessary or desirable to change a meeting date or time in the future. We are therefore presenting the amendment to the By-Laws as shown below.

This amendment will be presented for a vote of members at our May General Meeting on Monday. April 23, 2022, at 7:00 – 9:00 pm, in person at the Beecher Room at the Auburn Placer Library, 350 Nevada St., Auburn, CA, and also by Zoom, Meeting ID: 863 8770 8461, Passcode: Placer. This notice is issued in accordance with Article 4, Section 3 (a) of the PCGS By-Laws/

ARTICLE 4. MEETINGS OF MEMBERS SECTION 1. PLACE OF MEETINGS. Meetings of members shall be held at the Auburn-Placer County Library or such other place within Placer County as may be designated by the Board of Directors. SECTION 2. ANNUAL AND OTHER REGULAR MEETINGS. The members shall meet annually in November of each year, for the purpose of electing Officers and Directors and transacting other business as may come before the meeting. The Board of Directors shall designate the time and place for the annual meeting and notify the membership in accordance with Section 3 below. The annual meeting of members for the purpose of electing Officers and Directors shall be deemed a

regular meeting and any reference in these Bylaws to regular meetings of members refers to this annual meeting.

Other regular meetings of the members shall be held on the fourth Thursday of each month, at-Board of Directors. No meeting shall be held in December.

If the day fixed for the annual or other regular meeting falls on a legal holiday, such meeting shall be held at a time and place designated by the Board of Directors.
